## Infection Preventionists Are Underutilized and Underappreciated. The CDC estimates (at a

minimum) that 35,000 individuals die each year from resistant organisms with another 12,800 patients dying from *C. difficile*. This does not count the long-term disability many of the survivors will endure. The United Kingdom's Wellcome Trust report estimated that by 2050 antibiotic resistance will have a cumulative cost to the world of \$100 trillion dollars and 10 million lives will be lost each year.

## Health Watch USA<sup>sm</sup> Action Letters to CMS and FDA for the promotion of record retention and Ready Access for Patients Regarding the Unique Device Identifier of Implanted Medical Devices.

- 1. Action letter to CMS requesting that informing a patient of an implanted medical device's information and UDI should become a condition of participation (COP) for a facility. - 2. Comment letter from Health Watch USA<sup>sm</sup> (lead organization) and 14 non-profit advocacy organizations regarding tracking and preserving the medical device's Unique Device Indicator records, along with information regarding the distributor and prescribing physician. The UDI is a code which identifies the device. However, in the event the device is removed from the patient or the patient dies the records of the UDI may be deleted. In addition, there are no requirements for medical device implants to directly contain the UDI. #### Newly Approved Test Can Diagnose MRSA in 5 Hours.

"Kevin Kavanagh, MD, the founder of Health Watch USA, a not-for-profit patient advocacy group, has been an outspoken proponent for better approaches to MRSA detection. "The cobas vivoDx MRSA diagnostic test has great potential," Kavanagh tells Infection Control Today. "Rapid testing and screening for MRSA is of utmost importance in the identifying of carriers and in the control of spread of this dangerous pathogen. The United States Department of Veterans Affairs and the United Kingdoms' National Health Service has reported great success in strategies aimed at carrier identification along with isolation and decolonization. These targeted strategies have the advantage of reducing the microbiome's exposure to antiseptics and antibiotics which will lessen the (chances) of promoting the development of antibiotic resistance."
