
#### Will the COVID-19 Pandemic Transform Health Care?



### 2020, Nov. 18: COVID-19: COVID-19: COVID Facility Updates for Public K-12 Schools

Ken Wertz, Executive Director of the Massachusetts Facilities Administrators Association, discusses environmental considerations to make facilities safer during the COVID-19 pandemic. The processes of cleaning, disinfecting and sanitizing were discussed. The difference between a disinfectant and sanitizer was illustrated with the shift to students eating in classrooms. Before the change, a disinfectant was

used to clean classrooms, but after the initiation of this strategy, a safer product, a sanitizer, needed to be used. In addition, pandemic strategies involving heating and air conditioning systems were explained along with the difference between air quality and air flow reports. The latter being of utmost importance in a pandemic. Strategies of air filtration and sanitation using UV Light and bipolar ionization of the air were also discussed. ### Experts say COVID-19 vaccine will come with challenges and cautions after distribution

"Even after a vaccine is approved for the novel coronavirus and is widely distributed, it will still be important to follow public-health recommendations to thwart the spread of the virus, including basic hand hygiene, social distancing and wearing a mask......All that said, Kavanagh said if you are at high risk for COVID-19 or a frontline worker, it may be in your best interests to get the vaccine, after weighing the risks and benefits. As for the rest of the population, the months-long wait for universal distribution will give time for more research, he said: "By that time, there'll be a lot more safety data, and data on the vaccine's effectiveness.""

#### **COVID-19: SCOTUS Strikes Down Church Mandates - Is it good public health policy?**

Dr. Kevin Kavanagh from Health Watch USA<sup>sm</sup> discusses the Federal and Supreme Court rulings which struck down church mandates and explains that the discussion appears not be one of the power of government over churches but one which demands consistent uniform COVID-19 control strategies. In New York City, bars and restaurants are open but churches closed. In Kentucky, college sporting events are playing but church schools are closed. All of this causes confusion with the public. This ruling may lead to a national strategy which is pathogen not venue based and one not influenced by political or economic pressures. In addition new research on masks was discussed along with errors in the AstraZeneca/Oxford Vaccine Trial. Finally, exposure risks and how masks and goggles may provide some protection. #### 2020, Nov. 9: COVID-19: Vaccine 90% Effective - Virus Mutating

Dr. Kevin Kavanagh from Health Watch USA<sup>sm</sup> discusses the new Pfizer Vaccine which is reported to be 90% effective in preventing COVID-19 (prevention of deaths was not an endpoint). This underscores the necessity to follow public health advice so the virus does not spread further and mutate. Mutation of the virus became even more of a concern with the report from Denmark of a mutant strain in minks which appears to be vaccine resistant and it has jumped back to a few humans. The outbreak is contained and 17 million minks were culled. There are also reports of up to 10 laboratory made SARS-CoV-2 mutations which may also be monoclonal antibody resistant. Jack Pattie Show. 
## Spread of mutated coronavirus in Danish mink 'hits all the scary buttons,' but fears may be overblown

In a statement, the Danish Ministry of Environment and Food said the country would cull its entire herd — estimated to be about 17 million animals — after finding mutations in the viruses from the mink that it believes would allow those viruses to evade the immune protection generated by Covid-19 vaccines."

# **COVID-19 The Need for the Public To Embrace Public Health Strategies**

Dr. Kevin Kavanagh from Health Watch USA<sup>sm</sup> discusses reasons why the public has not embraced public health guidance. # **COVID 19: History of Ineffective Infectious Disease Policy**

Dr. Kevin Kavanagh from Health Watch USA<sup>sm</sup> updates his previous lecture which traces the history of the United States' response to the COVID-19 epidemic. A historical perspective is given, covering President George Bush's 2005 proposal of the Pandemic and All-Hazards Preparedness Act to the disastrous second peak of the first wave with

continued shortages of medical supplies and the changing federal advisements on asymptomatic spread, viral aerosolization and use of masks. Finally, risks and mitigating strategies are described in various retail and community venues.
- 2) COVID-19 Characteristics of the Virus, Symptoms & Long-Term Disability: The course discusses the characteristics of the SARS-CoV-2 virus along with the body's immune response and dwindling prospects for herd immunity. Characteristics of COVID-19 along with protracted recovery and disability is also discussed.
- 3) COVID-19: Presentation In Children and When To Open Schools: The course discusses the various presentations of COVID-19 in children, and the risk of childhood transmission to and infections of adults. Current guidance on opening of schools along with international experience on school openings is also discussed.
