A Kaiser Foundation tracking poll found that 57% of Americans now feel it is important to tackle health care reform now. This opinion is strongly split on party lines. 42% feel they will be better off if health care reform passes, 23% feel they will be worse off.

#### Medicaid

Medicaid currently services 60 million individuals. Spending growth in Medicaid was 7.9% in 2009 (5.8% projected). In addition, states estimate that in 2010 Medicaid recipients will grow 6.6% – Kaiser Foundation.
