Angioplasties Reported to be Overused.

Of the 600,000 angioplasties done each year, 70% are performed for acute symptoms of a heart attack and are appropriate.

Of the remainder which are performed on patients with stable, mild or no symptoms the following patient benefits were found:

11.6% are Inappropriate 38.0% Benefit Uncertain 50.4% Procedure Appropriate

Regarding Toro and the University of Michigan healthcare systems: "....the new policy (full disclosure) was adopted, the hospital system's malpractice claims declined by 36 percent, and the average cost of resolving a case dropped 44 percent, from \$410,000 to \$228,000. Some of this improvement is almost certainly due to the fact that the Michigan system now provides better care — but that's an even better reason for trying a new approach."
