Metal-on-Metal Hip Prostheses are Breaking Down.


The metal on metal design is in some patients causing metal fragments to build in the surrounding tissues which in turn is causing significant tissue destruction.

State of Maine Releases Hospital Admission Data on MRSA Admission Surveillance of High-Risk Groups.

This study found that in14 out of 32 hospitals in the state of Maine, greater than 10% of the patients admitted to the ICU were MRSA culture positive. In dialysis units where at least 10 or more MRSA cultures were taken, 8 units had a rate of positive cultures of greater than 25%. Patients who had stayed at least one night in a nursing home had the highest rate of positive MRSA cultures on admission. 32 out of 36 hospitals reported a rate of over 10%, 20 of these hospitals reported a rate of 20% or greater, 7 hospitals reported a rate of over 30% and one hospital had a rate of over 40%. http://mainequalityforum.gov/2011 Final HAI.pdf

Articles on the MRSA Epidemic:

In the year following detection of MRSA colonization, 33% of high-risk tertiary care patients developed an infection. "In high-risk tertiary care patients, newly-detected MRSA carriage confers large risks of infection and substantial attributable mortality in the year following acquisition." -- Sept. 2011 http://www.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/pubmed/21949707

"Routine surveillance for MRSA in ICUs allowed earlier initiation of contact isolation precautions and was associated with large and statistically significant reductions in the incidence of MRSA bacteremia in the ICUs and hospital wide. In contrast, no similar decrease was attributable to the other infection control interventions." -- Oct. 2006 http://www.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/pubmed/16983607

Patients hospitalized in a room whose prior occupant was MRSA positive had a 3.9% chance of catching MRSA compared to a 2.9% chance if the room was negative. For Vancomycin Resistant Enterococci (VRE) these values were 4.5% and 2.8%. -- Oct 2006 http://www.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/pubmed/17030826
