



The National Scorecard on Rates of Hospital-Acquired Conditions

The scorecare shows "that about 125,000 fewer patients died and more than \$28 billion in health care costs were saved from 2010 through 2015 due to a 21 percent drop in hospital-acquired conditions (HACs). In total, hospital patients experienced more than 3 million fewer HACs from 2010 through 2015. HACs include adverse drug events, catheter-associated urinary tract infections, central line associated bloodstream infections, pressure ulcers and surgical site infections, among others.

The main issue is regarding the accuracy of the finding that the intervention caused a 42% decrease in MRSA infections. HW USA submitted a Letter-To-The-Editor to the American Journal of Infection Control regarding this issue.

Although the author provided a response, we are still not able to reconcile the newly provided data in the letter with the article's concluded result. We calculate a 30% reduction from the data in the letter. However, the manuscript stated there was a 42% reduction. Below is a second comment expressing these concerns.
